SANDRA M. SCHNEIDERS received her doctorate in theology from the Gregorian University in Rome and is currently professor emerita of New Testament Studies and Christian Spirituality at the Jesuit School of Theology of Santa Clara University and the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, CA. where she has taught since 1976. She has been a member of the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary of Monroe, MI since 1955.

Sandra Schneiders is author of thirteen books and over a hundred articles. Among her recent publications are *Finding the Treasure*, *Selling All*, and *Buying the Field*, a trilogy on *Religious Life in the 21st century*, *Jesus Risen in Our Midst: Essays on the Resurrection of Jesus in the Fourth Gospel*, and *Prophets in Their Own Country: Women Religious Bearing Witness to the Gospel in a Troubled Church*.

She has received five honorary doctorates and numerous other recognitions of her work in biblical studies, theology, and spirituality.

Sandra Schneiders is a past president of the Society for the Study of Christian Spirituality and of the Catholic Biblical Association, and is a member of the Catholic Theological Society, the Society for New Testament Studies.

She is a frequent lecturer throughout the United States and Canada, as well as in Europe, Asia, New Zealand, and Australia.
